

Through all this, there has been a general acknowledgement by all of the Club's proud history and the role that it plays within the community and a sentiment that we must work to continuing its legacy and future. During the last 63 years since the foundation of the Club Fogolâr Furlan -Melbourne, we have faced and overcome many challenges that have come our way. The last 12 months has been difficult for all and the Club has been impacted by restrictions imposed and necessitated for everyone's safety. Our thoughts and prayers are with you and your families as we continue to struggle and cope with the pandemic, hoping that like a bad dream, it will all be over soon.

Since its foundation in 1957, the Club has seen some wonderful times and reached some memorable goals. The members and volunteers were always there to pull the Club through during the more difficult times and deal with the bumps and obstacles that were found along the way. This was always done with comradery, good will, courage and determination as they managed to find ways to make it through. Some decisions had to be taken which may not have been popular with everyone, but were seen to be necessary, for the general good of the Fogolâr. This year, like every other year, your Executive Committee has done its best to keep the Club on course against much adversity

The year started relatively well. Our Sunday night dinner and dance events were well attended. This was then extended to Thursday nights with the popular Ballo Liscio. The Saturday afternoon functions organised by the Social and Volunteers group in the Members Bar proved to be a hit with our patrons. We are most grateful to the volunteers who prepared some of the food and the delicious home-made sweets that we all enjoyed. Having the hearth (fogolâr) in the Members Bar lit and glowing with real burning logs was very welcoming and added to the ambiance, especially during the colder months. We held a very successful Dance Party in the bocce area that saw many hundreds of young people come through our doors. As well as being modestly profitable for the Club, the event was well organised and controlled. Our plan was to continue running similar events through the year. However, our plans were dashed by some apparent "noise complaint" made by one neighbour to the Darebin City Council. We had to abandon this venture or face litigation with the Council which we could not afford.

During the year, we have had some VIP's visit the Club. We were honoured by a visit from the President of the Regione Friuli Venezia Giulia, Dr Piero Mauro Zanin who presented our Club with a commemorative medallion from the Regione FVG. We also had a visit from Robert Clocchiatti and his partner from the Famee Furlane of Toronto - Canada who had come to Australia on a golfing holiday. Both visiting groups were presented with a copy of our Club's history book. Following the departure of Adriano Luci, Ente Friuli Nel Mondo have appointed Loris Basso as their new president. I had the pleasure of meeting Loris Basso online during a world-wide video conference of Fogolârs.

We have appointed a new Operations Manager, Dario Bulfone. He has been working most diligently in planning a revitalisation program for the Club which was going to be launched on 3rd April 2020 - Friuli Day. Due to Covid-19, this and all our other function and activities had to be shelved and postponed to a future date when we can all safely meet again in relative safety. However, bills still must be paid and presently this is a big challenge with no income being generated.



Most recently we have put together an Advisory Group which will help guide us through necessary changes, bringing fresh ideas, passion and energy to this project. With everyones support I am confident, we can get through this.

In the months ahead, we will be asking all members to support the club and help reenergise it from fundraising to feet on the ground. We would like to see the club survive, not only for those who are part of the club now, but for future generations to come. We want to do everything we can to ensure we are 'forever Furlan'.

The Club can be a beacon of culture, entertainment, sport and community where our beloved Friulian heritage comes to life through traditions, language, food and the spirit of Furlan.

 - Tap beer introduced (Birra Moretti)
 - Built productive relationship with suppliers Lion and Enoteca Sileno

- The Thorn Bar (re-launch)
 - New live music venue set to launch (postponed due to COVID)
 - Launch gig featuring local and international acts (postponed due to COVID)
- Bocce e Birra a family friendly afternoon event bring bocce to a new audience.
- Exhibition to launch Faces Of The Furlan
 - Created 'Faces of the Furlan' Calendario 2021
 - Photographic exhibition showcasing the people of the club
- Sports Complex

- Continued lobbying Local, State and Federal Governments to provide grants/funding for the installation of an indoor multi-sport training facility.

The club has many people working tirelessly to ensure it continues, but securing finance is vital for our future. We are continuously working on funding initiatives, seeking significant investment from Government grants, Corporate sponsorships, private investors and benefactors along with raising community funds through raffles, wine sales, the 'Calandario' and setting up a GoFundMe campaign. Coro Furlan

The passing of Maestro Gianpiero Canil had a huge impact on the choir. He was irreplaceable as a teacher, music arranger and conductor. The men in the choir enjoyed the camaraderie and decided to continue to sing our favourite songs.

The Furlan club sponsored the Rassegna dei Cori last year and all six Italian choirs got together to showcase their talents. Gianpiero's health was failing very badly and out of respect for him, the Coro Furlan decided to go on stage without a conductor. Renato Vecchies just gave the starting note and we took a huge risk singing without guidance. All the other choirs had their conductors, and we did perform just as well as the others. The next event was the Christmas Carols at the club, where there were two choirs singing that night! When there are two or more choirs, there is always competition. The Coro Furlan were on home turf and got more applause than the other. At that time, we were accompanied by Tony Mandarano. A good night was had by all.

2020 started with tragic bushfires and a lot of donations were requested to help out regional Victoria. The Coro Furlan decided to donate their time and money to go to Myrtleford Italian Club. Joe Miot, a member of our choir is very well linked there and has a huge history in that area. It was easy to get a time for performance at the Savoy Club. Will Musig came on board and has taken over the job of Gianpiero Canil. The Coro Furlan would go on 29th March 2020 to do a show. The money raised in Myrtleford would go to the local community.

The Coro Furlan asked no money from the people in Myrtleford. It would also pay for the bus and meals. The Coro also asked the Banda Bellini to accompany them and to do songs from La Grande Guerra and then do a performance themselves. These services were all volunteered and the Banda would not need to pay for the bus (expenses Coro) but they would pay for their lunch at \$20 pp.

The representatives from Savoy club and Myrtleford were ecstatic but then the pandemic came.... It is well known that, thanks to Covid-19, the choirs around the world were the first to shut down and will be the last to open up again. This is because singing causes fine droplets to be emitted and with them, the virus hangs in the air for a long time, ready to contaminate others. We cannot sing with masks on. In March 2020, USA choirs were big

examples of virus transmission and deaths. On the 15th of March 2020, we decided to cease all live performances. Will Musig has been a great help and supporter of the choir, and we are indebted to him.

In our isolation our President Maurizio Borgobello has been conducting Zoom meetings every Tuesday evening and it has helped us mentally to cope with the situation. As a choir, we cannot sing on Zoom, because there is a half second lag at times and it sounds terrible. But, some have other talents and as individuals they play; the guitar, saxophone, tuba, mouth organ and voice solos too. There are only 2 members who are not connected to Zoom.

The Coro Furlan is looking forward to starting up again at the Furlan Club. Will Musig wants to continue this tradition and with him we can go on and do it.

Soccer Group

Dear Members and friends,

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, this year VicSoccer, like many other codes, decided to cancel the playing season. This was a tough call to make but the correct one at the end.

To be honest, in the 30 years of being part of the social Club and the soccer group, last season was the toughest year that I've experienced as we struggled as a soccer club to fill a senior and reserve team. This was due to the lack of numbers brought on by the poor facilities of the playing grounds. One of the biggest complaints was the lack of training lights.

Previously we had 5 teams representing the Club and 130 registered players. The numbers were growing but the facilities we had at our disposal were limited and therefore the numbers dropped off dramatically.

Finally, this year Thornbury United FC, which had been in operation since 1983 known as Udinese, sadly lost all of its teams except for the under 35's squad. The team has now decided to merge with Northern Falcons, another Club located in the Darebin area. This too was a difficult call to make.

I wish the Furlan Club all the very best as they work through the very difficult times ahead. I thoroughly enjoyed my time at the Furlan club. Thank you for your support over the past 30 years.


